From Patricia's Corner

The topic this month is works. Eph. 2:8-9 says "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of Works, lest any man should boast." Titus 3:5 says "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost". We are saved through our faith.

A Christian is one who belongs to Christ by definition. John 14:15 says that we can only be his if we *obey* whatsoever he asks of us. This is reaffirmed in Luke 8:21 where Jesus says "...My mother and my brethren are these which hear the word of God, and *do* it." In Matt. 3:10 he said "...therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire." Ouch; I guess we have the Holy Spirit in us for a reason! Jesus also said the following of us Christians: "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that *doeth* the will of my Father which is in heaven." Could it be any clearer that we are to obey God's commandments and do good works? The consequences of not doing so are stark indeed.

In Luke 10:25 a lawyer asked Jesus what shall he do to inherit eternal life? Jesus' answer is to love the Lord thy god with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself. The not-so righteous lawyer's follow-up question was: Who is my neighbor? Jesus answered with the parable of the good Samaritan who was the only passerby who *did* anything to help the robbed and wounded victim left by the roadside. No matter how holy the priest and Levite thought they were and no matter what they believed, they *did* nothing to help when they passed by. Wasn't Jesus saying that if we don't love our neighbor as ourselves we do not inherit eternal life?

Many New Testament scriptures tell us to do good works and why we are able to do them. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 says "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." This means the schooling in scriptural righteousness, perfects the man of God, and endues him with power for all good works. Not only does Titus 2:14 tell us that we are to be on fire to *do* good works but that Jesus died to purify us to *do* good works after redeeming us from sin. In the next chapter of Titus, Paul says that we are to affirm constantly that we who believe in God are careful to maintain good works because they are good and profitable unto men [Titus 3:8]. Our Christian duty, if you will, is to provoke or excite one another unto love and good works [Heb. 10:24].

True enough that works alone will not save you, but faith must be accompanied by works. James 2:14-18 says: "What doth it profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? Can faith save him? If a brother or sister be naked, and destitute of daily food, and one of you say unto them, Depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled; notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body; what doth it profit? Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone. Yes, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my

faith by my works." This last verse means that the test of faith is works. If we truly have faith for salvation, we will do good works because of our faith. Said another way: faith is believing *and* doing.

What fruit we are bearing and what works for the kingdom of God we are performing. Are there needs in our church or community that we can meet? The opportunities are endless. Jesus commands us to teach, preach, and heal. We are to do just what he did and more! We have anything we need to do it: the inspiration and wisdom of the Word and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Glory to God!
