With these dreams being birthed in them, restlessness often builds in our spirits as the Holy Spirit stirs to “pull up tent pegs” and inspires us to go where He leads.

With respect and affection, it is our joy to bless the Potter’s with prayer in sending them out to follow the dreams that God has placed in their hearts. My heart and the heart of our Elders and Deacons was to formally pray over them and send them out from us to do the work of the Lord, but as was expressed so tenderly to me in an email from Doc; *“Even though it seems that our paths of ministry must diverge, we want you... both of you (speaking of my wife Pat and I)... to know that we still hold you close in our hearts and still consider you our pastor. Our love for you goes so deep that Paula has said that while she is touched by the offer to publicly commission us, she simply could not stand before the congregation without breaking down. To us – but particularly to Paula – this is like leaving home again.”*

Doc and Paula... you are on a God-inspired journey. Ecclesiastes 3:11-14 encourages us that *“He has made everything beautiful in its time. Also He has put eternity in their hearts, except that no one can find out the work that God does from beginning to end. I know that nothing is better for them than to rejoice, and to do good in their lives, and also that every man should eat and drink and enjoy the good of all his labor — it is the gift of God. I know that whatever God does, It shall be forever. Nothing can be added to it, And nothing taken from it. God does it, that men should fear before Him.”*

### OBSERVATIONS

Once an understanding of God's promise is reached, it is necessary to believe that promise. I determined to make a study of giving and receiving in the lives of Christians I knew and then match the result of my study to God's Word. Since all of God's principles are given as examples for living, an applied principle must be verified in changed lives. If it isn't, we're probably misunderstanding the principle or else not applying it. Before I define the scriptural principle, I will give some observations of the study that started many years ago and still continues.

1. Most Christians give far less than one-tenth of their income to work done in the Lord's name.
2. Many Christians give at least one tenth of their incomes regularly but do not experience what they assess to be God's material or spiritual bounty.
3. Many Christians give at least a tenth of their incomes and can identify many instances of God's abundance, either materially, spiritually, or both.
4. A small percentage of Christians give far beyond a tenth of their incomes but cannot identify anything they would describe as God's abundant return.
5. A very small percentage of Christians give far beyond a tenth of their incomes and can identify God's response, both generally and specifically.

Of course, there were other categories and instances in which Christians moved from one group to another. Many of those can be explained because of spiritual growth or withdrawal, which obviously affects every area of our lives. A few can be classified as unique from a biblical perspective. That is most clear when a spiritually mature Christian gives in great abundance and outwardly appears to suffer materially. The apostle Paul would most assuredly identify with that group. God has a separate and unique plan for such people, and the depth of their commitment to Christ sets them apart in spiritual blessings. I offer some observations about these groups, with no intent to be judgmental. I believe God has provided us with material indicators of spiritual conditions. They are not for accusation but for admonition.

### **DON'T ROB GOD**

Those who give less than a tenth of their income limit what God can do for them according to His own Word. "Will a man rob God? Yet you are robbing Me! But you say, 'How have we robbed Thee?' In tithes and offerings" (Malachi 3:8). Lest we somehow believe that principle applies only to the Old Covenant, Paul amplifies it for us: "Now this I say, he who sows sparingly shall also reap sparingly; and he who sows bountifully shall also reap bountifully." (2 Corinthians 9:6). A lack of giving is an external material indicator that spiritual changes need to be made.

Those who give more than a tenth, but not sacrificially, may experience God's abundance according to His plan for them because they are meeting God's prerequisites for them at that time.

Many who give what we consider a material abundance and do not experience any particular spiritual or material reply may actually be giving for self-motivated reasons. Many people try to bribe God into blessing them. They are like Simon in Acts 8, who when he observed the benefits of God's power tried to acquire it without meeting the spiritual prerequisites. They demand God's blessing to reward what they consider to be their sacrifice. They are not in subjection to God but are trying to exercise control over Him. Paul addressed that attitude also in Romans 11:34-35: "Who has known the mind of the Lord, or who became His counselor? Or who has first given to Him that it might be paid back to him again?"

### **GOOD REASONS (In Giving)**

1. Giving should be an outward, material expression of a deep spiritual commitment, an indication of a willing and obedient heart. (See Malachi 3:8; James 1:22; 1 John 3:17.)
2. We should give out of grateful hearts and with an attitude of joy. "Let each one do just as he has purposed in his heart; not grudgingly or under compulsion; for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9:7)
3. Some may have the spiritual gift of giving described in Romans 12: 8. These people live disciplined lives, which enables them to give generously. They are especially sensitive to the needs of others and conscious of the need to check out every cause to which they give.
4. You may give out of conviction. Perhaps the Holy Spirit is prompting you to give to a special cause. How can you determine if such a desire to give is actually from God or just an emotional response? Read God's Word and pray.

## **WRONG REASONS (In Giving)**

1. Giving for the express purpose of receiving does not please God. Many people try to bribe God by giving to Him first. They quote Luke 6: 38 as their reference. It is true that God will spiritually and physically bless those who give – but only when our motive is right and we are giving out of a sincere desire to please Him. (See Acts 8 and Romans 11: 35)
2. Some give out of fear. Reverence for and respect toward God, when tempered with confidence in His love, are signs of spiritual maturity. That is not the kind of fear I am referring to. What I warn against is giving because someone told you that if you don't give God will punish you. If you give because you feel intimidated, you are giving under compulsion, which is contrary to God's Word (2 Cor. 9:7). Never support a ministry that uses threats as a fund-raising gimmick.
3. Giving to impress others does not impress God. (See Matthew 6:3). People who have a problem with pride need to do their giving modestly and humbly. That doesn't mean that all giving must be done entirely in secret... but we are not to draw attention to ourselves when we give. Allowing your children to witness your giving, particularly when sacrifice is involved, will teach them the importance of commitment. Giving for applause or approval, however, is unscriptural.

## **WHY GIVE TO GOD?**

1. Give out of your abundance according to the principle taught in 2 Cor. 8: 14. God doesn't want you to give until you are made poor, unless it is to improve your spiritual life. A balanced attitude toward material things can be found in Prov. 30: 8-9. God's main concern is your heart.
2. Commitment is an important ingredient in giving, but confusion exists when it comes to distinguishing between faith promises and pledges. A faith promise is a commitment to give a certain amount, which allows ministries to prepare good, logical financial planning for the year. It is understood that if God doesn't provide the funds you're not obligated to give them. A pledge, on the other hand, is an absolute commitment to pay something. This type of giving is presumptuous, where-as a faith promise is scriptural (He. 11: 1)
3. Not all giving consists of cash donations. You may donate your time or services or noncash gifts, such as food, furniture, and clothing. Avoid giving useless or junk gifts. You also may give something with an appreciated value (an asset you bought at a low price that is now worth much more). In this category might be stocks, bonds, jewelry, real estate, or anything that increases in value.
4. Some organizations encourage people to borrow to give. I do not believe that is scriptural. It doesn't require much trust to borrow money. Deut. 15: 4-6 says that if we obey and trust God, we will not have to borrow money. There is no example in Scripture of God ever using a loan to manifest His will in the lives of His people.
5. Sacrificial giving is a way to honor God but, once again, it should be the result of a good attitude, not a desire to impress others. All of us have been called to suffer for Christ according to Phil. 1: 29. In today's generation that may not include a great physical sacrifice, but it does require an understanding that the purpose of our abundance is to further the kingdom of God. Neither a voluntary rejection of all wealth nor a display of material success is evidence of a balanced Christian walk. In this country, however, few of us have a problem with sacrificing too much.
